## Roles and Responsibilities of Indoor Program Director

It is recommended that this position is shared between three people:

- Once person to look after facilities,
- One to look after adult programming and
- One to look after children programming.

### **Role:**

Responsible for the planning, management, and coordination of all indoor recreational activities, fine arts and crafts programs.

### **Responsibilities:**

- Attend monthly Executive meetings, report to the Executive the progress of registration, participation, etc.
- Prepare a list of programs to be offered, time schedules and fees to be charged for approval by the Executive.
- Apply through the public school board and through the principals of the separate schools for the use of school facilities.
- Coordinate the registration of the fall, winter and spring indoor programs.
- Prepare information and reports to be submitted to the Association and Leisure Services Department.
- Prepare Program Information Forms (blue sheets) and submit them to Leisure Services. Submit request to the City for instructors and hire instructors where necessary.
- Ensure registration date, program activities, descriptions, locations, dates, times and fee schedules are advertised in the SHCA newsletter prior to registration.
- Problem solve situations arising with schools, caretakers, programs and participants.
- Submit an annual budget.
- Recruit volunteers for parent supervision and registrations.
- Watch for and encourage new individuals to volunteer for SHCA.

### **Time Commitment:** Intense

- Attend monthly meetings
- Keep Executive up-to-date as to enrollment, cancellations, problems, etc. of programs
- Follow monthly tasks guidelines

In June of 2006 the Saskatoon Police Service launched the Anti Graffiti Unit, the first Unit to target graffiti in Saskatchewan. Since that time the Unit has been very active in reducing graffiti by investigating and holding graffiti vandals accountable for their actions.

From June through December 2006 a total of 103 charges involving graffiti were laid against 23 individuals. An additional 7 people received warnings and 3 were dealt with through diversion.

One full-time investigator makes up the Anti-Graffiti Unit. Cst. Lee Jones has received training in both New York and Seattle.
